Senator Beutler's amendment, and I might add to this in addition to what Senator Schimek said, that we will look at some other areas of this particular form of government in Nebraska during the next session and see, as Senator Beutler has called attention to an area that is outdated, and there may be other sections, as you realize commission form of government is unique to Nebraska City only, and so many times we change ordinances in other areas and don't...or change laws in other areas having to do with this form of government and don't do it in this area. So there may be other areas like this, and I thank Senator Beutler for calling this to our attention. I do support his amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Does anybody else wish to speak to the Beutler amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Beutler? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the Beutler amendment to LB 950. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Beutler amendment? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 950 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You have heard the motion to advance LB 950. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 950 is advanced. LB 982.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 982, I have no E & R. Senator Conway would move to amend the bill, however. (See AM2957 on page 870 of the Legislative Journal.)
