CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 1006.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1006 is advanced. LB 1006A.

CLERK: LB 1006A, Madam President, is by Senator Landis. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, this is a \$7,000 A bill. It's paid for out of funds that the Department of Insurance raises through their fee schedule in the department. There's no General Fund outlay. It is for the purposes of writing rules and regulations pursuant to the bill's passage. I would urge its adoption.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Landis. Does anyone wish to speak to this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 1006A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 1006A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1006A is advanced. I will now recognize Senator Moore.
