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may not be politically wise, it might be politically necessary. The question is raised where is the money going to go, that the city gets this windfall, and what are they going to do with it? Well, there is a little thing called a recession going on right now, and sales projections are down in the City of Omaha. The City of Omaha just gave a raise to the police department. It is going to cost a couple of million dollars extra. The city council may, indeed, lower the mill levy. They would have the authority to do that. So I think that question is bogus, at best. What we ought to do is we ought to defeat the Chambers amendment and move the legislation that allows the City of Omaha to do what every other city in the State of Nebraska can do, and that is if it wishes to charge a fee, it can do so by a majority vote of the city council and the approval of its mayor. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Horgan. Senator Beyer.

SENATOR BEYER: Question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Are there sufficient seconds? We will now vote on the motion to cease debate. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Senator Horgan.

SENATOR HORGAN: I would ask for a call of the house and accept call-in votes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion to place the house under call, all those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. Would the senators please check in. We will accept call-in votes on the motion to call the question.
