PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rogers. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Madam Chair, and members, I, too, would rise to commend Willard Waldo for his long service to agriculture in the State of Nebraska. I am pleased that he is receiving this award and I certainly wish him well in the future.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. Does anyone else wish to speak to this legislative resolution? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to adopt LR 233. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LR 233 is adopted. LR 234.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, LR 234 was introduced by Senators Baack and Conway. It's found on page 475 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President, and colleagues, a little more...a little more prepared now than I was when we first started. LR 234 is another one in the series of four resolutions for honoring the people with Statehood Day. The 234 is to honor Reuben Snake, a junior who has been a leader among the native Americans in Nebraska and also nationally. He has done a number of things dealing...he has been the Chairman of the Winnebago Nation. He has also been the President of the National Congress of American Indians. And he is being recognized, being awarded with the Trailblazer Award in association with the Statehood Day. So, with that, I would urge your adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Speaker Baack. Does anyone else wish to speak to this? Senator Robinson.
