of us the way it was introduced. We should continue to look for alternative funding. The committee amendments don't represent, in my opinion, a viable alternative. I think even those who support it, the amendments that went into that, and I said when I supported the sales tax, that this is probably only for a very short time that I will support breathing a little revenue life back into this bill through the committee amendments. Well, that time has come and I don't support them at this point. Maybe someone else should have closed on the committee amendments, and I apologize...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...for those who introduced the amendments to the committee amendments, but it is not what the intent of LB 1120 or the intent of the Revenue Committee, the majority of the Revenue Committee members who advanced those committee amendments out to us and put them in front of us. It was to make a shift away from personal property, exempt it all, that is intact. That is intact in the bill as it is in front of you. What has changed is the revenue source, and it has made a shift to individuals to the majority of the funding in this bill that I will not support. But LB 1120 and the committee amendments, as they came out, did not do that. They put it back on business. They did it in a responsible manner, and we will have that bill in front of us if these committee amendments are rejected, and we will walk through that process all over again. I would urge you at this point to reject the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hall. You have heard the closing on the committee amendments. We will now vote on the committee amendments to LB 1120. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. A record vote has been requested. Senator Moore.
