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the Department of Motor Vehicles to come up with a new license other than what is in their time schedule for the new imaging process and so forth that they have planned. So it would not create any adverse impact on the Department of Motor Vehicles as far as coming up with a special driver's license just for this bill. We could give you a lot of examples of what this can mean and has meant to many people across the state and across the country because you're talking about more than just a state organization here and we had a lot of people testifying at the hearing. They were heart surgeons, they were people who had received hearts, kidneys, those that had also been donors in the past and the positive, extremely positive things that happened because of this particular program. At this point, unless you would entertain some questions, and would be glad to give you some examples of where this program and how it has worked in the past, but at this point I would urge you to look carefully at the bill and support it and would take any questions that you might have.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen, would you like to finish your time?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I would, Mr. Speaker, thank you. Thank you, Senator Hillman, for making that explanation of the bill. The committee amendments specifically do a couple of things that I think you should be aware of. Senator Hillman and I have talked about that, but it does provide the operative date to be January 1 of 1994 so scooting that date back. It provides also for this brochure. That's in the original bill, but it strikes the current language that provides the anatomical gift shall constitute the legal authority. You still need some consent to do those things. There's a list of those who can give consents. Another big change that was made in the committee amendments would be the requirement that the donor be at least 19 years of age. Committee amendments strikes that out. With that, I would urge the adoption of the committee amendments. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen and Senator Hillman. Discussion on the committee amendments. Senator Hillman, did you wish to discuss the committee amendments right now? Senator Byars, the committee amendments.

SENATOR BYARS: I would rise briefly, Mr. Speaker, to add my support to this legislation. As those proponents came before our committee to tell the stories relative to family members,
