SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Byars. Senator Kristensen, do you wish to discuss the committee amendments?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. The committee amendments also... Senator Hillman talked about it, and I neglected to touch on that is that the Department of Health is taken out of this procedure. They have no problem doing that. That became the expensive part of doing this bill and the exact fiscal impact that has changed, Senator Hillman, I don't know what that figure is off the top of my head but it substantially cuts down on the cost of this bill and so the fiscal note you do see is not accurate at this point if the committee amendments are adopted. The other thing we did add that I think is important is this not only goes towards body organs, but it goes towards tissue. A lot of the medical technology that comes around today deals in the area of tissue retrieval and that this is something in the past we've not had. I think this is a helpful part of the committee amendments and, Senator Hillman, if you would like to take the remainder of my time, do you have a figure on what it saves? I don't have that off the top of my head, but it does substantially from the committee testimony cut down the cost of this bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Thank you. The estimate that we got from the Department of Motor Vehicles to be able to store this information was somewhere between 20 and \$25,000 and to keep the record. The fiscal note that you see in with the bill was because there was going to be an additional recording in the Department of Health. After going through, found that that really was not a necessary step. It would not help the process. There are other areas where that information is stored and storing it again in the Department of Health would not help the program. So I believe it's a little over \$44,000 that is on the fiscal note and you could at least reduce that to half.
