then, Senator Kristensen? While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 641 and LB 722. The next speaker is Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker and members, I'll use the time now instead of speaking on the bill. I rise in support of the committee amendments and the bill. The committee amendments, one of the things I particularly like about it is I think it will decrease the cost side of the bill so I rise in support of that obviously, but the bill itself I certainly rise in support of. It's a bill that I think will make it certainly more convenient and easier for individuals who choose to do so, to participate in this sort of program. Obviously, many of you know my own family situation and why I support this and with that I'd ask for the support of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Hillman a few questions.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hillman, would you respond, please.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hillman, on page 7 of the white copy in lines 8 through 11 you've stricken language which says that the mere having of this information...I guess by striking this language, what is the effect of it instead of me giving an opinion.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, would you give me the page number again in the white copy?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, page 7, lines 8 through 11.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, that was the signature shall constitute sufficient legal authority for the removal of a body, organ, or part of the license. No such authorization of an anatomical gift may be noted upon the license of any person under the age of 19.
