SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Ashford, would you respond, please.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Ashford, are you preparing a section by section paper for us on what this bill says?

SENATOR ASHFORD: Ah...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Or do you have one?

SENATOR ASHFORD: Senator Haberman, what I have is what you have before you which is a summary of what the bill does, and you should have that on your desk. If you don't, I can just give this to you now, but there is such in a document. We will just give it to you now here.

SENATOR HABERMAN: My next question is, on page 78, it refers to motor vehicles shall be valued at its net books...net book value. Who determines what the net book value is?

SENATOR ASHFORD: Senator Haberman, that is part of LB 1063 and the existing LB 1063 language, and maybe someone else could better answer that.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, this isn't what I wanted, Senator Ashford. I wanted a section by section dissertation on what this bill does. This is the whole bill that you just gave me.

SENATOR ASHFORD: No, no, it isn't but it is a portion of the bill.

SENATOR HABERMAN: It's not the whole bill?

SENATOR ASHFORD: No, it is a portion of where the amendments are located, I think, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, that is your amendment, Schellpeper. Mr. Speaker, Mr. Clerk, are we talking about Senator Ashford's LB 1120 amendment, AM3109?

CLERK: Senator, yes, but he is also amending that with AM3123 which, I believe, is more of a technical amendment. AM3123, Senator, is just a short one-sentence amendment to the amendment.
