equipment and business equipment. That's already in the bill. You have this list of services which is already in the Ashford amendment. Basically, what the polic...and the breeding livestock issue will be dealt with following this because we divided it out. The real policy distinction between your amendment now, the part of your amendment that is before us and what Senator Ashford's amendment is, you're saying we should do the one-half cent sales tax collection fee, \$6.7 million instead of what he is proposing in his amendment which is the farm auto repair and the business auto repair. Is that correct?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: And other repair, personal also (inaudible).

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR WITHEM: Other repair, some personal is included?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR WITHEM: Excuse me, was that a time?

SPEAKER BAACK: No, I was just recognizing Senator Schellpeper to answer your question.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Those...you're right, those three things are different.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay.

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR WITHEM: So, basically, the distinction in the Schellpeper amendment at this point, this portion of it, the only policy consideration is do you keep the sales tax collection fee in place or do you replace it with...or do you keep these repair aspects in place, as they are currently in the Ashford amendment, or do we limit those and put the sales collection fee? That is the policy consideration before you at this point. Frankly, to me, it's not a very significant one. I am going to oppose the adoption of the Ashford amendment no matter what form it's in, so it really makes no difference to me what form you put it in, so I don't think the Schellpeper
