LB 985, 999, 1004, 1063

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1105-06 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 40 ayes, 0 nays, 9 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 985 with the emergency clause attached passes. We'll now to LB 999.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 999 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 999 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1106-07 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 41 ayes, 0 nays, 8 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 999 passes. We'll go to LB 1004.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1004 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BAACK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1004 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1107-08 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 44 ayes, 0 nays, 5 excused and not voting.

SPEAKER BAACK: LB 1004 passes. At the request of the introducer, we are not going to take up 1011, and we will proceed to Item 6 on the agenda, General File.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1063 was discussed by the Legislature yesterday. At the time that the Legislature adjourned, there was pending an amendment to the bill by Senator Warner. Senator Rod Johnson had offered an amendment to the Warner amendment, AM3240. Senator Hall asked for a ruling from the Chair with respect to the germaneness. The Chair ruled the amendment nongermane. Senator Johnson then moved to suspend the germaneness rule so as to permit consideration of his amendment. That motion is now pending.
