

the section dealing with ag equipment, that then, too, because of the uniqueness of the way the amendment is drafted, those two then would become germane by virtue of adoption of the sales and use tax amendment. So in my opinion, the amendment in total is germane. If there was a division of the question raised and in the order that those could be taken up, if the sales and use tax on ag equipment is taken up first, which is germane, it would automatically make the other two germane to the bill as amended.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Moore, I am going to rule based on Senator Warner's explanation that the amendments are germane.

SENATOR MOORE: I will respectfully disagree but I don't...well, it...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President, if my memory serves me correct, you ruled yesterday since the...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yesterday you ruled, the Chair ruled yesterday that the sales tax on farm equipment issue was not germane to 1063, and that ruling was upheld. So today Senator Warner, bless him, put in an amendment that has to do with sales
