

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I assume that he just will do that. The commissioner, if it was wrongfully paid, or, for example, if you didn't list it on your personal property...

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, I asked...no, I asked, what's he going to do with the money if he recovers it, if he takes it away from the person who paid it?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I assume that that stays in the General Fund.

SENATOR HABERMAN: But it doesn't say that, does it?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I...

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, it says...now, wait a minute, now when we were talking about...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Haberman, I'll be glad to answer your question if you give me a chance to answer it. If not, I'll listen to your (interruption).

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, you answered it because you said you assumed. But Senator Kristensen was more specific when we were talking about some bills in the past and I don't think we can take commercial agriculture, I don't think we can take...assume something to be proper. I believe Senator Landis isn't here, Senator Withem isn't here. What about Senator...Senator Wehrbein?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Wehrbein, on page 26, the taxpayer shall deduct and withhold, from the taxes otherwise due from him or her on his or her tax return, 2.5 percent of the first \$1,000 remitted each month, and 1 percent of all amounts in excess of \$1,000 remitted each month. Explain to me what that means?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, it's simply changing old language and using different figures and I assume that that means the businessman that is collecting withholding taxes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: It says taxpayer.
