

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Hall, I will rule that they are divisible and I would like to have Senator Warner indicate to us how he wishes those taken up.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, the Section 100 and 101, I would take them up just in the order of the sheet that I provided at the desk for dividing which, if I understand it correct, Mr. Clerk, Sections 100 and 101 would be first, and then the portion of Sections 178, 179 and 181 would be the second division...

CLERK: Yes, although the way Senator Hall wants to do it, Senator, would be 178 and 179...

SENATOR WARNER: And 181?

CLERK: Well, he's...he...because 181 can flow both to the refund issue and the collection fee issue, he is preferring that it be included in the third part. If you notice on the sheet that you and I...181 is listed under both sections. Do you see what I'm saying?

SENATOR WARNER: I...Madam President, the sheet I gave the Clerk was one which I asked bill drafters to separate for me by a division of the question on the basis of what was logically separated and that's the reason that it is the way it is.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, Senator Warner, I would...I have no objection to that. I think it's...it's a technical issue, E & R, 181 could go either way, in my opinion. I have no problem if it's included as part of the second division of the question. So I would concur with that change.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay. So my understanding is that we will first take up Sections 100 and 101 and then Sections 178, 179 and 181, and then 180, 182, 183, 185, and 186. Is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: I believe so, yes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay.

SENATOR WARNER: Okay. Actually, I believe that Section 181, if I'm reading this correctly, Madam President, is subdivided because of the relationship between those issues. You've got a
