

Landis voting yes. Senator Horgan voting yes. Senator Lindsay voting yes. Senator Cudaback voting yes. Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Hefner voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Debate has ceased. I will now go to Senator Warner for closing on his amendment to the amendment. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, again, just briefly summarize, I'm sure everyone knows what the amendment does, but essentially it has for its purpose to make sure that we balance the receipts and the expenditures as far as the General Fund is concerned which includes then the energy tax of 4.5 million, sales tax reduction that will save 3.7 million, and then the reduction in aid to counties, 3.5 million. Again, I have two amendments that will follow that are corrective amendments to the basic amendment that have been passed out and I have explained two or three times. But with that I would hope that the amendment will be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Warner's closing. We will now vote on the amendment offered by Senator Warner. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1148 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is adopted. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to Senator Warner's amendment is, Senator Warner, AM3257. (Amendment appears on page 1149 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is essentially a corrective amendment to the amendment.
