

floor, and there was, it was 1120. The body decided to bring 1063 out, I would have voted that bill out of the committee. I told the Governor give me the fifth vote and you've got it. The fifth vote wasn't there in committee. This...1063 just advanced. It was amended, over the last couple of days, to include virtually similar kinds of proposals that are in 1120. We winked at the germaneness rule in the bill and said we can go ahead and amend it. The bill is out there on Select File and fair game to be amended in any way that 1120 could be amended. It makes no sense to me, and I intend to offer amendments on Select File to 1063. Don't think that I have abandoned the cause or the issue in 1120. I guess the Governor wants his bill, he wants it to be 1063. I don't have any problem with that. I prefer not to see my name on a tax bill that is going to tax personal property again. He would like to have his associated with it, I understand that, it's no problem. And I want to give him that...afford him that opportunity. I just don't think it makes any sense, because as long as you have two bills out here, you're going to be talking about the concept in 1120 as opposed to the concept in 1063. I think you need to focus the arguments, clearly because of the issue of just pure time in this body, we are not going to get back to 1120, if it would fail to advance on General File or if we should adjourn without advancing it today, which is my greatest fear. So just...it makes good sense, I think, to clean it off the agenda and work on 1063. I read in the paper tonight that there's a group of rural senators who will confer with the Governor. Ha, I didn't get invited to that meeting either. But there...that's where the focus needs to begin, that's where the discussion needs to be focused. I intend to offer amendments, I don't know when the expedited bill will be back down, but I've got a feeling it won't be too long. And I think that's where, on Select File, the issues that are present in 1120 ought to be addressed. And, for that reason, and that reason alone, has no...no bearing on my position on where we ought to go on the tax issue, I just don't think it makes any sense to have two bills, I didn't when this debate began, I haven't changed my opinion of that, for that reason I'm going to vote to IPP the bill.
