SENATOR CONWAY: Request has been made for a call of the house. Would all in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CONWAY: The house is under call. Will all members report back to the Chamber and record your presence? The house is under call. Senator Beutler, please check in. Senator Chambers, will you check in please. The house is under call. Please, everyone check in. Senator Hall, we are missing Senator Ashford. Would you like to proceed or not, with or without him?

SENATOR HALL: (Mike off) Go ahead without him.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Clerk, would you like to call roll, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1167-68 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 8 nays, on the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CONWAY: Motion fails. Mr. Clerk, anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do, I have an amendment from Senator Ashford.

SENATOR CONWAY: Raise the call. Senator Ashford is not here, so we will move on with the discussion towards the advancement of LB 1120. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, you won't let me kill it, you won't let me amend it, you won't let me advance it. I'd move for unanimous consent to bracket the bill till March 16.
