SENATOR HALL: Okay, what is Article III, Section 18 then?

SENATOR WARNER: There are people helping me turning pages, Senator. I don't have it right here in my hand.

SENATOR WARNER: Section 18...

SENATOR HALL: Nobody is fighting for the microphones tonight.

SENATOR WARNER: Right, this is the one that the Legislature shall not pass local or special laws in any of the following cases. That is to say that those are spelled out here.

SENATOR HALL: Why does that need...

SENATOR WARNER: There are a series of them.

SENATOR HALL: Why does that need to be in there?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, one of these I am sure...I am sure one of these has to relate to computation of taxes because that is what all these are in here. That is why this amendment is in here.

SENATOR HALL: But it would apply to those other provisions as well because...

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR HALL: ...we include the entire article, the entire section, so all those would be...they wouldn't apply to personal property as it relates to special legislation. Is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: The answer is correct. I'm also told that all those things together probably are part of the equal protection clause so they ought to be all inclusive.

SENATOR HALL: So, in your opinion, would that give constitutional protection to a personal property exemption that existed under 775?
