Would the senators please check in. The House is under call and I will recognize Senator Warner for closing while the senators check in.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, the closing will be brief. Rather than again review what is proposed in the bill at this point, I'm sure it is well understood, I'm sure we all know how we're going to vote, but I would urge again is the bill be advanced. With the request of Senator Hall that the copies be made so, from E & R, so it's all intact and easier to read will provide us an opportunity then at Select File to look at the bill in its entirety and give further consideration to those amendments that people wish to discuss. But at this point I would just suggest that the bill be advanced as soon as the absent members have returned.
