SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 1178.

CLERK: Senator Wehrbein voting yes. Senator Chizek voting yes. Senator Dierks voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: The committee amendments are adopted. I will raise the call but I would encourage members to please stay close to the Chamber so we can continue to conduct business. We need to keep going today. We've got lots of business to conduct before the end of the session. Senator Hillman, to open on the advancement of LB 1178.

SENATOR HILLMAN: I think we've had quite a bit of dialogue. A few other things that I would like to point out is the process will not take place until new drivers license are issued. There won't be any extra expense to the state to do this. Also, the fiscal note that goes with this will be \$12,000 and this will be just for the extra recording that will be required by the Department of Motor Vehicles. They've been extremely helpful in this project and are willing to work with us, excited to work with us. I think it's a project again that where I see, and we talk about them a lot, but they're public-private partnerships and I think that's the way we get a lot of things done and that is with government assisting a private sector and this would be a good way to do that. I urge the advancement of the bill.
