We had an excellent hearing on your bill and certainly a lot of support and there is a lot of interest in Senator Morrissey's bill and a lot of support as well. And so some of the particular concerns I have, I think we can take some time to address, but, at this time, I very much support the advancement of the bill and, again, thank Senator Morrissey and Senator Rogers for their initiation of these issues.
