

and I do think that, to some degree, this racism is a generational thing and our younger people are not as apt to be motivated in that direction, but you still see examples of it. You still see school systems that have problems with it and I, for one, am in favor of implementation as soon and as fast as we can so, therefore, I will not be supporting your amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I was hoping Senator Withem would come up before me. He was going to say that...I might as well tell what he was going to say. He was going to mention that Senator Schimek was glad I was here. He said he was up here, he was going to say well, that's not the consensus of the body, but you know, I don't believe that kind of stuff. But maybe it's good there is someone like me here. So as I listened to Senator Bohlke and I listened to Senator Schimek, so they would be for submission of all curriculum because the schools can't be trusted. Yes, come on, come on now. Ardyce, you're saying that the...we pass the bill, then the schools won't do anything with it. Well, there's no guarantee they will do anything with it. If you think there is one person over at that state department is going to make sure this is implemented, people, you're not living in the real world. Hopefully, it will be. I have enough faith in our school people out there that it will be, but it's no guarantee, it's no guarantee. But that's what you're telling me, Senator Bohlke, is we should have every curriculum of every subject matter because we're just not sure whether it's going to be in those schools or not, we've really got to watch them. Maybe we ought to hire ten more checkers to get out there and check about 25 or 30 of those schools every year to make sure they are doing this. So...it's like writing in the curriculum. I don't think we have enough writing in the curriculum. How are we going to change it? You're going to change it at the school level. You're not going to man...mandating it from Lincoln isn't going to get it done. It's the people you have out in those schools that's going to get the job done. All we're doing is overburdening them with a big paper barrage to Lincoln. And if Senator Chambers thinks that...if he feels that is going to get the job done, I don't know, he's whistling out there in the wind someplace. And I told him, I like his bill, but this is the bad part of it. It shouldn't be in there. I'd urge you to support my amendment. Thank you.
