

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Madam President, Senator Robinson, what I stated was that because you said every curriculum of every school district, no. What I stated was that when we are introducing a new program that is particularly new to every school district across the state, that I think there is a greater need to seeing that that program is implemented and seeing that there is a method for assessing if that's true. So I think because it's new, I think that we need to make sure that it's being implemented and I think, as Senator Withem spoke about the accreditation team, if we have this annually, we will then make sure every time one of those teams go out that that is part of what they're looking at and seeing if that's in place at those school districts.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: There's only Senator Robinson wishing to speak so I will recognize him for closing. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I'll make this very brief, well, as brief as I can make it, Senator Lindsay. And going back to what Senator Bohlke said, you know, we really should take a good look at these new curriculum when they get out there. But she doesn't say how long. Does she mean into the year 2020? Annually means annually. Are we talking about twice? Are we talking about three times? Are we talking about once and then they forget about it? That's why I say if we take it out, leave it up to the state department. If they want evidence every year, they can have evidence, but we don't need the word "annually" in there, we don't need it. I'll close. This is something that should not be in statute. I'd urge you to vote for my amendment. Thank you.
