LB 922, 1063

SENATOR WITHEM: I would merely move the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. We'll now vote on the Withem amendment to LB 922. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the Withem amendment to LB 922? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Withem's amendment to the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. It is after 10:00 a.m. and we will move to Item 9 on the agenda, Select File, LB 1063.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 1063, the first item for the Legislature's consideration are the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I would like to point out to the body that the E & R amendments to LB 1063 are a white copy that is in your bill books, it's AM5267. So, as we're considering the bill, that's what to look at from now on. I would move the adoption of the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Hillman would move to amend the bill. (Hillman amendment may be found on page 1092 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hillman.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Madam President and members, in looking at 1063, when we've been going through this and trying to decide what's going to be the best policy, one of the things that I had a concern about was the actual implementation when it comes to filing the personal property tax. Personal property tax has been referred to over and over again as a liar's tax. What I've tried to do is to come up with some form of implementation that would make it just a little bit tighter system, a little bit more of an accountable system, and this is the amendment then
