I do urge you to support this amendment. I think it is perhaps more important than what you realize, particularly as it would be employed in the case of the death of an owner, a sole proprietor who owned a business. The tax consequences or the potential tax consequences to those folks are quite...potentially quite burdensome, quite onerous, and I think something that we're not intending to get at with the system that is advocated in LB 1063.
