

have seen, in addition to the probably 20 to 25 million increase in real estate taxes, of course, whatever share they get out of the increased sales tax. I believe Senator Hall said 10 million. If that's the number, I do not know, but if it was then you're increasing agricultural taxes, it would seem to me, in the vicinity of 35 million or thereabouts. So I think you ought to think carefully before you vote for this proposal because it's impact I think is significantly different than what I hear most of you addressing as you speak to the amendment.
