SPEAKER BAACK: Time.

SENATOR HALL: ..property. I would urge the amendment be adopted. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Hall. You've heard Senator Hall's closing on the amendment. We will now vote on the Hall amendment to LB 1063. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. A roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1242 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 24 nays, Madam President, Mr. President, excuse me.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have...

SPEAKER BAACK: The call is raised. Members, do please stay close to the chamber though so we can continue to conduct business.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lindsay would move to amend. Senator, I have AM3339 with a notation you wish to withdraw that and substitute 3371.

SENATOR LINDSAY: That's correct, Mr. Clerk.

SPEAKER BAACK: No objections, so ordered. (See Senator Lindsay's AM3371 as found on pages 1243-47 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. AM3371 is coming around to you. It just came down from Bill Drafters. You may have an earlier version of it, 3363. If you have that copy on your desk, those sections remain in the amendment. There's some additional sections that have been added into 3371 which were added at the request of Senator Warner. I'll give
