

system, through the companies. The DeKalb man up there probably wouldn't even remember 847, corn; made a tremendous difference. Today the seed trade is so successful all the way from the people who are developing the new strains to those who are multiplying the seeds to the amount that the commercial farmer can use them that they tend to be ignored. I think it is especially appropriate as we are talking the tax issue and whatever that we take a little bit of time this morning to memorialize the improvements that have been made. The standard of living in this country would not be possible were it not for the tremendous, tremendous improvements in genetics in all of the varieties of crops that have been made over the last 60 or 70 years, and certainly the last 40. We wouldn't be a nation of cheap food were it not for this whole group of people. I thank Senator Schrock for bringing this resolution and certainly stand in support of it. Thank you.
