

They said probably what would happen would be that, as far as doing away with their accreditation is concerned, would be to...they would write a letter immediately to the school district and tell them that they would have to appear at the next State Board of Education and justify why they do not have a multicultural or whatever deficiency they have in their curriculum. And after that, the State Board of Education would have to make a decision, but no way could it go by over six months in correcting that. I can support section...I can support subsection (2), Section 3 of the amendment of Senator Bernard-Stevens, but I have problems, I still have problems with the annual report because I think it is a...I think it is a paper barrage on the State Department. In fact, I think Senator Chambers would be defeating his purpose. If you are going to, every year you are going to get 800 school districts to bring...send in a review of their curriculum. I don't think...I don't think we want to spend 75 or 80 thousand dollars to have that person to do that. I think his time would be much better spent out in the schools seeing if these programs are being implemented, instead sitting over at the State Office Building fumbling through curriculum reviews. I have an amendment that would...that we would...each school would send in their curriculum for two years, and then it would become part of the curriculum process. No other curriculum is sent in more than once. Why wouldn't two times, sending this curriculum in twice and then utilizing this consultant's time to go out there and review the schools. And as Senator Bernard-Stevens says, they do 25 or 30 random checks of schools now. They don't send them notice. They come in and they say we want to review your curriculum. So there is going to be a certain number of those schools, every school is going to be on the watch because they know they could be...they could be reviewed in that certain year. So I support Senator Bernard-Stevens amendment, but I will have an amendment that will, instead of an annual submission of the curriculum for multicultural education, I will have that reduced to two times. Another point, and...
