

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: But I would be willing, at this point, at least in my judgment, and I come from a different experience than Senator Chambers, and I understand that, I would like to give the department a chance to do it right. They informed me that they want to do it right, they believe it is important. This is the way we can get in and actually verify that it is being done, that we can be sure it is being done, and it won't be a pro forma thing. If, in fact, the department fails to follow through, goes back on what they said they are going to do, refuses to do in the way that it needs to be done so it actually is being done, then I would be that senator, Senator Chambers, that would be introducing the bill, if you decided you did not want to, that would, in essence, do what you indicated we should have done in the first place, and I would give you the opportunity to say, Senator Bernard-Stevens, I told you so. And I would get that opportunity to do so. I urge the adoption of the amendment, but, if not, I urge, no matter what, the voting for LB 922.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. We will now vote on the Bernard-Stevens amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: A call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Have a request for a call of the house, all those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

Senator Rod Johnson and Senator Kristensen. Senator Lynch, Senator Beyer, and Senator Wesely, would you please return to the Chambers and check in. We will proceed with the vote on LB 922.
