

certainly of the opinion that the voters of the State of Nebraska seem to understand that a vote no on the CA in May, if indeed that's when it does happen, that there certainly would be the possi...there would be the possibility, not...that's the possibility that you may or may not want to risk a vote on but, nevertheless, it would be constitutionally allowable if the CA fails in May that the Legislature convene in a special session if they do not want inventory to go back on the tax rolls. With 33 votes at that point in time, they could exempt all personal property from taxation. So that is one scenario people need to be aware of. I mean, the bill may say it all goes back on but there will be one last trap door if that CA fails and so it's a vote against the CA by the public is not tantamount by itself to vote to placing it on the tax rolls, so, obviously, if we...obviously, there's a great desire by many people, you have to have a gun at people's head or they won't adopt the amendment, I'm doing all I can to get that gun out of their hands, out of the administration's hands to allow people to make a reasonable choice as to what tax policy they want to pursue. The second question I have of Senator Warner on a different vein, if he would so yield. Senator Warner, there's been much talk in the halls, I don't know if it's been in public in the paper but how the administration has said if, for whatever reason, the CA does not get 40 votes, there is the notion that there is somehow the possibility of moving all reporting dates back till after the November election? I mean, is that...do you concur with that statement that that would be the next plan of attack, if the CA does not get 40 votes, is on the ballot in November, 1063, we have to move all those reporting dates, compress them all in between...I'm assuming we have to compress them between the date the canvassing board meets on January 1. Is that what...is that what you, as the introducer, is that what you would say if the CA fails, that's the way you would do with 1063?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Moore, as you are aware of discussion, which I think goes a little further than what you have suggested, that, in fact, as I recall, Senator Withem said on the floor, it seems to me that he had an amendment prepared that would roll...it would move the dates further back if a constitutional amendment was put on in November. It's different but it could end up the same thing...
