With that, I certainly would urge the amendment, of my amendment to the Lindsay amendment, and that we can then examine what his language does and what sort of standard that puts us on for the future. But I don't see any legitimate reason for not taking out that date at this time. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. We will now vote on the Kristensen amendment to the Lindsay amendment to LR 219. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed, nay. Have you all voted on the Kristensen amendment? Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed, nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Will all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I'd accept call-in votes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We are accepting call-in votes on the Kristensen amendment to the Lindsay amendment.

CLERK: Senator Hall voting no.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Would the senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence, the house is under call. Senator Cudaback, please check in. Thank you, Senator Cudaback. We are accepting call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Will voting yes. Senator Rogers voting...Senator, you had voted yes. Senator Horgan voting yes.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Beutler voting yes. 26 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment to Senator Lindsay's amendment.
