PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. Before we proceed, I would like to call the senators' attention to the area under the south balcony. A special guest today of Senator Schrock is his father-in-law, Eldon Grove, of Edgar, Nebraska. Would you please rise and be recognized. Welcome to the Chambers. Thank you. We are now back to the Lindsay amendment as amended. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Lindsay?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, members, the Kristensen amendment became the Lindsay amendment or the Lindsay amendment became the Kristensen amendment, depending on how you want to look at it. The amendment, as it stands now, gives some restraint on the ability of the Legislature to exempt personal property. There is...there is still, as Senator Moore puts it, the opportunity to fight another day. But there are limitations on...or ground rules on how that fight will take place. And that is that we will be limited to exemptions which are reasonable. The discussion, I think, that took place on the Kristensen amendment, I think, set forth as well as possible what that standard would be at this point. I believe it's a good change. The Kristensen amendment was a good change. I think it's a good middle ground for both sides. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.
