PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...property, we throw those out the window with LR 219. Again, no tax system is worth that. No tax system is worth throwing away your Constitution of its protections. And I think that to say let's do that before they have the...even the ability to understand how it affects them personally, which they will in November, it makes no sense to reconsider. I think it's a fair opportunity in November to let the people vote on it. But if the votes are here to do it, so be it. If the votes have changed over the lunch hour, so be it. Let's move along and deal with this issue. I'm ready to again vote red. I am not and have not tried to convince anybody how to vote on this issue today. I...I think it's time to vote, and I hope we will soon.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President, members, unlike Senator Schrock and Senator Robinson, I think we will reconsider. I think we know what is at stake here. The Supreme Court has spoken, and it isn't a matter of if everything goes on, as of January 1 everything is on, we failed to realize this. We've told you that from the beginning, everything is on as of this minute. We need a tool to take, get rid of the personal property as such. We need this tool, LR 1063 is that tool, it is that tool. If you were on an island for one year and all you had to eat is broccoli and you don't like broccoli, you have your choice, you either die or you eat broccoli. Folks, I suggest that you eat broccoli. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President and members, I guess I'm going to eat broccoli and I hate broccoli. I've had my lunch handed to me on this floor before, and I'll have it handed to me again. But I had a big lunch, and I got it handed to me big time, as many of us have on this issue. I chastised the Governor last week, about two weeks ago about being a good loser, and I hope maybe I've learned how to do that, because I think we are a loser and I think the body is a loser in this one. But I do support the reconsideration motion. It's one of those things if the Governor wants it on the ballot in May, I'll give him the
