PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Rasmussen. Does anyone else wish to speak to this resolution? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to adopt LR 267. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LR 267 is adopted. We'll now proceed with Select File, LB 470.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, with regard to LB 470, I do have E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 470.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have is from Senator Landis. Senator, this is AM2958. I have a note that you wish to withdraw it. In that case, the next amendment is from Senator Landis as well, that's AM3142.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. This is the bank structure issues for the year. And the amendment that you see annotated on the board is basically the contents of LB 1215, a measure that the Banking Committee heard earlier this year and advanced on a 7 to 1 vote for submittal to the Legislature. Because of the existence of this bill on Select File, we thought it was appropriate to make an amendment to LB 470 containing the, in essence, the terms of LB 1215, so that we could coalesce this debate at one time on this issue and on this bill, so that all bank structure issues would come at one time.
