SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Madam Chair, or Madam President and members of the body, I would just make the same arguments that I made before. Briefly, the language that we're using in this amendment is already in the liquor control statutes. It's... I think it's a reasonable amendment and it's certainly not going to harm the bill and I would just like to see it attached. So, with that, I would move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schimek. We will now vote on the Schimek amendment to LB 130. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: I have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Would the senators please check in. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Microphone not activated)...votes, so we don't have to go through the roll call.
