Benjamin Nelson, Governor of the State of Nebraska, has proclaimed the week of March 15 through March 21, 1992, as State Agriculture Week throughout the state. Now, therefore, be it resolved by the members of the Ninety-Second Legislature of Nebraska, Second Session: That the Legislature declare March 15 through March 21, 1992, as State Agriculture Week in Nebraska in conjunction with National Agriculture Week. That the Legislature urges Nebraskans to honor and thank Nebraska farmers and ranchers by supporting and participating in the State Agriculture Week in Nebraska. And all of you senators will have a sack, I think, delivered to your offices exhibiting all the products that are made in Nebraska. I think a lot of us don't realize that how many products that are value added in the State of Nebraska making one of the largest industries we have. And also I would encourage you to walk down by my office some time this morning and look at all the posters we've got on the walls showing all the products that are produced in Nebraska and I ask for your support for the resolution and Speaker Baack would like to have a couple of minutes.
