RECESS

SPEAKER BAACK PRESIDING

SPEAKER BAACK: Good afternoon and welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber. Roll call.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do you have items for the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined engrossed LB 130 and find the same correctly engrossed, and LB 424. Senator Moore would move to place LB 1294 on General File notwithstanding the action of the Government Committee. That will be laid over. (See pages 1388-91 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now proceed to General File and LB 872.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 872 was a bill that was introduced by Senator Hefner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8. At that time it was referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have Judiciary Committee amendments pending. (See AM3127 on page 1129 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: To Senator Pirsch for the Judiciary Committee amendments.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. LB 872 relates to motor vehicle operation and the taking of chemical tests to determine the blood alcohol level of drivers who have been taken across state line for medical purposes. LB 872 also attempts to allow evidence or the test results received from out of state to be admissible in Nebraska. The committee amendments simply enhance that attempt by Senator Hefner and they were drafted in close consultation with Senator Hefner. We strike the original Section 3, which deals with limiting the liability for the civil
