

the bill, you will learn more about the federal hammer that is over the State of Nebraska that requires those states that do not have safety belt laws to divert some of their highway construction fund money and move it into safety belt education programs. The laws or the amendments I think make the law relatively mild, and certainly puts us not at the forefront of other states, and puts us at minimum level of seat belt enforcement. I think it takes out much of the opposition to the bill, and for those reasons, I would recommend that you vote in support of the committee amendments. Thank you.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Mr. Speaker, and members, again, I'd just for a brief review for those people who may have come in, there are four major changes by the committee amendments. They are, briefly, that this will become a secondary enforcement action, not a primary enforcement; two, that it would apply only to the front seat driver and to the other occupants of the front seat; three, that this would be a one violation only per...let's say there were a number of people in the vehicle that were in violation, the driver would be responsible, the driver would be the only one that would receive a violation, it would be one ticket per stop; and, fourth, it would be an operative date of January 1, 1993. Those are the major changes made by the Transportation Committee and I'd urge their adoption. Thank you.
