But it is just like the seat belt law, what are they going to do about it? You can't do anything about it. Because the Legislature in their wisdom says to the body, you shall wear a seat belt in the front of your vehicle but you don't have to wear them in the back, but we are going to save millions of dollars. Now why is that so important to somebody, we are going to save millions of dollars. You know, it kind of behooves me a little bit, they are willing to spend this money in other areas, but when it comes to making a point, we are going to save millions. I mean, somebody has or is mixed up just a smidgen, and I have to mention to you one more time, this body passed a seat belt law and the citizens said we don't want it. That is good enough for me.
