

SENATOR PETERSON: Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: And I will get you the study I'm talking about, so you can see what I'm tal...what I'm referencing.

SENATOR PETERSON: Yeah, we didn't realize this until Senator Moore just caught it, and that's all we have to do, in my estimation, Senator Wesely, is change the...just the word "cost" to "space", I think.

SENATOR WESELY: Well, I think again that may initially look agreeable, but it's that very space issue that came up in this research we did, and I'm very concerned about its cost. There may be more implications here than we realize. So, again, I'll try and track that down and try and understand what your amendment does in that regard. But I'm just indicating that there is something more here than meets the eye.

SENATOR PETERSON: If you would like, I can withdraw the amendment and we can discuss and move the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR WESELY: I would prefer that.

SENATOR PETERSON: Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall, did you wish to address the Peterson amendment?

SENATOR HALL: No.

SPEAKER BAACK: Okay. Oh, it's withdrawn. It is withdrawn. Okay, thank you, Senator Peterson.
