CLERK: The resolution is found on page 1362 of the Journal, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes, Mr. Speaker, and members of the body, this resolution honors the Humphrey St. Francis boys' basketball team for a come-behind win over Wallace to win the Class D-1 State Boys' Basketball Championship. Their name is the Flyers. The Coach is Paul Brungardt. I would like to congratulate the coach and his team for having 25 wins and one loss. And this is the fourth straight tournament in five years that it has won the state championship. And I would just ask the body to approve the resolution. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Robak. Any discussion? Seeing none, we will now vote on LR 273. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 273.

SPEAKER BAACK: LR 273 is adopted. We'll now proceed to Item 6 on the agenda, the motion by Senator Moore.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Moore would move to place LB 1294 on General File, notwithstanding the action of the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker and members, this is the third or fourth chapter, I guess, in the story this year over the Athletic Commission. As you will recall, there's been an ongoing...well, for two years now the body...well, last year a deficit appropriation, the first time ever, the Legislature appropriated General Fund dollars to sustain and subsidize the state's Athletic Commission and LB 1022, in its present form the committee recommended and then when the Legislature adopted the committee amendments yesterday, we funded the \$228,000 to the Athletic Commission and subsidizing in General Funds for the '91-92 fiscal year. The Appropriations Committee was of the opinion that if we are going to, instead of continuing to subsidize the historically cash-funded agency in the Athletic
