

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. The house is under call. Members, return to the Chamber and record your presence. While we're waiting, I can introduce guests of Senator Rod Johnson, 38 seventh graders from Sandy Creek School near Fairfield and sponsors. They are seated in the south balcony. If the group would please stand so the Legislature may recognize you. Thank you. Senator Baack, Senator Lindsay, Senator Chizek, Senator Dennis Byars, please return to the Chamber. The house is under call. Senator Rod Johnson, Senator Horgan. The members are present. Senator Moore, did you wish a roll call vote? Roll call vote, regular order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1419-20 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Motion fails. Go to General File, LB 1022. Are there are amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: The call is raised. Excuse me.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1022 was discussed yesterday by the Legislature. The first amendment that I have pending this morning is by Senator Rasmussen. Senator Rasmussen's amendment is found on page 1392 of the Journal.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes, Mr. Chairman and members of the body, this is the amendment that I began on yesterday. Basically, it is language to clarify the process for funding LB 701 that we voted in last year. If you remember, the process for doing that was to maximize federal Medicaid dollars by matching with state dollars that we already put forward for special education in the area of physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech therapy. We had proposed that if we took Medicaid eligible families and paid for those services through Medicaid dollars, we could raise enough federal dollars to pay for the new services referral and service coordination that we wanted to demonstrate in the projects.
