

SENATOR LINDSAY: I believe there are claims that have already been made but I would defer that to Senator Pirsch (interruption).

SENATOR CROSBY: Claims that have been okayed? Claims that have been okayed? Is that it, Senator Pirsch? And how much does that total?

SENATOR PIRSCH: That's correct. Right now, I believe, it's 89,000 which have been approved, processed and approved.

SENATOR CROSBY: And that would be paid between February and July? Is that what you're saying?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Well, no,...

SENATOR CROSBY: Because they don't have that money.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...they're waiting for that money to be paid.

SENATOR CROSBY: But after July maybe you would have money to pay them?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Well, in July we're only going to have \$47,000.

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, the other...my point in bringing that up is...

SENATOR PIRSCH: It was cut in third.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...that I wanted to be sure what money you were talking about or who...what people you were talking about during that period because when you say that don't have an accident or don't get beaten up between February and July, when that happens you don't get paid the next day, you have to make a claim.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, no, although...although...

SENATOR CROSBY: I think you should make that clear.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...there is provision for emergency...

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...amounts to be paid.
