SENATOR CROSBY: Your amendment to an amendment, does the \$50,000 for instance on Legislature, is that for the primary and then another 50 for general?

SENATOR BAACK: No, this is \$50,000 for both in an election period.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. Basically what did you do to change the original bill, just a quick one sentence, could you tell me?

SENATOR BAACK: In this amendment?

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah.

SENATOR BAACK: The basic change in this amendment is to make it coincide with Senator Lindsay's, the spending limitations in Senator Lindsay's bill, LB 529. That's what this amendment does.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. I heard you say that and then I wasn't fast enough to...

SENATOR BAACK: We didn't want two bills out here with spending limitations in them.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. Well the reason I asked that question is I have a call from someone whom I respect greatly that was on your task force and wants the bill as it was originally introduced and she thinks the committee amendments take out some language that she would still like in there so if this moves today before Select File I'll try and figure out what all that is. I hadn't had an opportunity to go back and find out but in the meantime you did relieve me somewhat when you said it was 25,000 so it would be \$50,000, more or less 25 for the primary or 25 for general, however it figures out, right, for Legislature?

SENATOR BAACK: That is correct, 50,000 for...

SENATOR CROSBY: And these others are totals for primary and general both?

SENATOR BAACK: That is correct.
