

SENATOR WARNER: Those in favor of a call of the house vote aye, opposed nay.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: The house is under call. Members return to the Chamber and record your presence. Members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Hefner, Senator Hillman, oh, you're here. Senator Hefner, Senator Will, Wickersham, return to the Chamber, record your presence. Senator Moore, Senator Pirsch. We are taking call-in votes to cease debate.

CLERK: Senator Will voting yes. Senator Hefner voting yes. Senator Rod Johnson voting yes. Senator Landis voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Rogers had voted yes. Senator Beyer voting yes. Senator Morrissey voting yes. Senator Pirsch voting yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Clerk, record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Debate is ceased. Senator Baack, do you wish to close on your motion to amend the amendment? Senator Baack.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. Chairman and colleagues, just very briefly, this is a...basically a very technical kind of amendment to make the system flow and that's what, and as Senator Chambers says, if we don't put any money in, there is no need to worry about a Cash Fund but what this would do, it has the Cash Fund that would be created and the money that would be appropriated by the Legislature would go into that Cash Fund. Any refunds that would be due to the state because of violation of this law would also fall into that Cash Fund and this would allow the accountability and disclosure to compute how many dollars of public funds a candidate is eligible for and to allow them to send those funds to the candidates. With that I would just urge the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion is the adopting of the amendment. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator
