SENATOR WARNER: Senator Schimek, do you wish to speak to this amendment? Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: No.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Chambers, your light is the only on. Further discussion? Seeing no further lights, Senator Chambers, do you wish to close? Senator Chambers waives closing. Those in support of the Chambers amendment to the committee amendment vote aye, vote nay. It requires a simple majority of those voting. Have you all voted? Clerk, record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion carried. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Senator Rod Johnson would move to amend the committee amendments, Mr. President. (Amendment appears on page 1459 of the Legislative Journal.)
