

SENATOR WARNER: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Nothing further to the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Conway, do you wish to move the adoption of the committee amendments as amended?

SENATOR CONWAY: Most of the members...thank you, Mr. President, most of the members that are here I think have heard the continuing debate. The discussion of the amendments in essence do make up the bill so I have no further closing and not overly supportive of the legislation, but I will urge the body to attach the committee amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: Is there further discussion on adoption of the committee amendments? Seeing no lights, those in favor of the adoption of the committee amendments vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? Clerk, record. A record vote requested. Did I hear that? A record vote is requested. Mr. Clerk, record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 1459 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: The motion is carried. The amendments are adopted. Senator Baack, do you wish to discuss the bill? Senator Baack waives. Mr. Clerk, are there amendments to the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Chambers, discussion on advancement of LB 556.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I think this is a bad bill because I think it misrepresents to the public what is being done. By me making these comments I hope it's clear that I'm not impugning the motives of anybody who worked on this bill or that I am saying they are deliberately trying to deceive the public. I'm saying that an effort is being undertaken here which cannot be achieved no matter how a bill is drafted. You cannot hold water in a sieve.
