

straits we are in on the Appropriations Committee, you know, the Cash Reserve is going down. We hardly have...and we are going into the next biennium probably down anywhere from 25 million to 70 million, depending on what the revenues will be. Would you be willing to put this money into Cash Reserve?

SENATOR MOORE: The \$1.7 million.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, \$1.7 million, yeah.

SENATOR MOORE: Would I be willing to put it in the Cash Reserve?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah.

SENATOR MOORE: I'd be doing...to increase the Cash Reserve, I'd vote for that, yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: You may get the opportunity depending on what happens.

SENATOR MOORE: I will vote to cut to make things balance too.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, I may have an amendment for that on Select File. Okay, my closing comments, go home and tell your people you raised their property taxes \$1.7 million...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...or go home and tell them we are going to spend that \$1.7 million because we don't have enough courage to put them up on the floor and let each program fend for itself. That's what it is. I would urge you to vote for my amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Robinson. We will now vote on the Robinson amendment to the Bernard-Stevens amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted?

SENATOR ROBINSON: (Mike off) ...and a roll call vote please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
