

PRESIDENT MOUL: Are there sufficient seconds? There are. We'll now vote on the motion to cease debate. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Debate has ceased. And I'll recognize Senator Lamb for closing.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Madam President, members, just to refresh your memory as to what this amendment does. It takes \$5 million for the railroad, Light-Density Railroad Assistance Fund, for one year, one time, one time only. And then under the other provisions of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment, that money, which is about \$14.5 million, will be added to the Teachers Fund forever. This is a one-shot deal, takes \$5 million from the Highway Trust Fund for one time only, which does reduce the amount that goes to the Teachers Fund for one time only. Then the rest of the time all the money from that penny on the sales tax for motor vehicles would continue to go to the Teachers Assistance Fund forever, forever, or until this body changes it. Very logical, in my opinion, that if we're going to divert money from the Highway Trust Fund it go to a transportation issue. Very logical way to do it. I ask that this amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. We'll now vote on the Lamb amendment to the Bernard-Stevens amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.
